Junior Fire Crew Work Experience

The Chilliwack School District, in partnership with the BC Wildfire Service, is pleased to provide Jr. Fire Crew Work Experience (J.F.C.). The J.F.C. is a training program and career simulation activity, designed for students in grade 12 who are considering firefighting as a potential career option. Successful candidates will experience approximately 6 days of training, including classroom instruction and practical training exercises. Successful applicants can also receive 4 credits for a Work Experience 12 course (if applicable).

J.F.C. will be held at SD#33 between **March 24 – 29, 2025** (Spring Break), at the BCWS Cultus Base, located at 4225 Cultus Lake Rd. (map will be provided)

Applicants must complete the attached application <u>IN FULL</u>, including a cover letter and resume. Applicants must also attend an orientation/information session with a parent/guardian on **December 4 at 6:00pm** at the Neighbourhood Learning Centre, located at 46361 Yale Rd.

All applicants will need to complete a **Shuttle Run Beep Test**, which will be scheduled at your school in **January 2025** (dates TBD).

Students who complete the Camp MAY receive an opportunity to work as a paid Jr. Fire Crew Member with BC Wildfire Service throughout the summer months. <u>Not all</u> students will be selected for a paid position.

Applications MUST be received no later than <u>December 20, 2024.</u>

- Have maintained good attendance records
- Display willingness to work hard and are team players
- Completed the application in full by the application deadline: <u>Dec. 20th</u>, 2024
- ➤ Has been recommended by a school staff member
- > Be physically and medically fit
- Must complete the fitness "beep" test

- > Training Week Learning Modules to include:
 - S-100 (Basic Fire Suppression)
 - S-185 (Fire Safety & Entrapment Avoidance)
 - Navigation (GPS & Compass use)
 - Pumps & Water delivery
 - Fire Weather
 - Resume & BCWS Interview Skills
 - Mock Fitness Test
